

Lorne Hill Farm Quilting and Craft Workshop

Join us for creative days in the country!
Summer 2010

Lorne Hill Farm is a working farm and Caravan Club Certified Location situated on the edge of the village of East Garston, 6 minutes from Junction 14 of the M4 and 5 miles from Hungerford.

Morning and whole day workshops are held in the purpose-built workshop beside the house, with the emphasis on having an enjoyable day, or morning, out. A farmhouse lunch is included if you come for the day.

'Traditional' is the over-riding theme, with the aim of the workshops being a warm and friendly, non-competitive way in which to enjoy your craft and socialise with like-minded people.

'Pitch and stitch' sessions are held every Tuesday morning – Bring your sewing, knitting, crafting over to the workshop and work in company. There is a charge of **£4** to cover refreshments.

Quilting Workshops are held once a month and anyone interested in quilting is welcome - whether you are a complete beginner or simply needing a 'day away' to make progress on your quilt. These are also good days to come when you want to make something from one of our previous workshops. The **£20** charge includes a ploughman's lunch followed by a seasonal pudding.

We also have the **Hatched and Patched group** once a month which is where we work on the Anni Downs Quilt and Stitchery patterns. £15 for the day including Ploughman's Lunch

Knitted and crocheted decorations with Amanda Bond. Amanda designs and knits quirky accessories and gifts for children and adults which she sells through her company 'Westbrook Knits' – see her website www.westbrookknits.co.uk. In this workshop she will be teaching us how to make flowers and stars which can be used as embellishments for garments and bags, or on their own as brooches and hair accessories.

Japanese Folded Patches: A fantastic way to use up scraps of fabric and batting - Sandra will teach you this quick and versatile technique. This is a type of hand-stitched quilt-as-you-go method which allows you to make a patch whenever you have a few minutes to spare. Sandra made a bag with her hand-dyed patches – but if you get really hooked and have a lot of scraps to use up –why not keep going until you have enough for a really colourful cosy quilt!

Foundation pieced Log Cabin: Experienced quilter Helene Burgess will teach you how to do foundation piecing – a technique that enables you to produce really accurate work with the smallest pieces of fabric. Using a sewing machine, you will learn how to make traditional log cabin blocks at the same time as mastering a method which is often used in the making of picture quilts because it makes intricate piecing so successful
